Blend: 75% Merlot, 14% Cabernet Sauvignon, 7% Cabernet Franc, 4% Petit Verdot
Appellation: Columbia Valley
Vineyards: Dionysus, Stone Tree, Northridge
Wine Analysis:

- 6.15 grams/L Total Acidity,
- 3.74 pH,
- 15.5% Alcohol

Techniques: 20-32 day maceration. Aged on fine lees and racked once before bottling.

Oak Program: 37% new French oak
Production: 4,032 bottles

You've heard about Washington Merlot right? This wine is no exception my friends. The BFM stands up to its reputation of being the biggest merlot based blend coming out of Washington today.

We produce this wine for our wine club commonly known as the Stained Tooth Society. The STS members suck up about half of the total production with the remainder being allocated to our distributor network. Get on board and score some BFM!

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2012 DUSTED VALLEY BFM Wine Advocate - 91 Points

A blend of 75% Merlot, 14% Cabernet Sauvignon, 7% Cabernet Franc and the balance Petit Verdot, the 2012 BFM is a rounded, balanced, nicely textured and medium to full-bodied red that gives up ample black cherry, kirsch, and raspberry fruit mixed with spice and toasted bread nuances. Aged in 22% new barrels, there were just over 300 cases made and it will offer plenty of pleasure over the coming decade.
